

Techniques with Fabric and Stitch with Deborah Boschert

Explore several techniques for creating interesting shapes, patterns, symbols by manipulating fabric, thread and embroidery floss. Explore free-cut fused shapes, learn to outline for emphasis, create layers with sheer fabrics and add glitz with foil. Plus, options for unique stitching by machine and by hand. Students will leave with a collection of inspiring examples to add to their own creative process.

All levels, Technique Class — complete several 6 x 6 inch samples

Supply List

4 fabrics Three solids and one coordinating print.

- five 6.5 inch squares of each fabric — 20 squares total
- if possible, pre-fuse all squares before the workshop

*** felt twelve 6.5 inch squares

2 yards fusible webbing If you have not pre-fused your fabric. I strongly recommend Misty Fuse.

*** parchment paper or teflon sheet

3 to 5 skeins of embroidery floss or perle cotton Choose colors that coordinate with your fabrics.

embroidery needle and thimble (if you use one)

fabric marking tool such as chalk pencil or disappearing ink pen

scissors Large and small, and one that you can use with paper

sewing machine including supplies necessary for free motion stitching

thread, two or three colors that coordinate with your fabrics, include a top stitching thread and needle if you have them

*** tulle 1/2 yard in a color that coordinates with your fabrics

***tracing paper and card stock (You'll only need one or two sheets. Students could share.)

pins

***iCraft Decofoil one sheet in silver or gold or a color that coordinates with your fabrics

***sketchbook, pen and pencil

creative spirit!

Optional

- rotary cutter and mat
- *Art Quilt Collage: A Creative Journey in Fabric, Paint and Stitching* by Deborah Boschert
