Experience Level	I suggest choosing small to medium scale prints that appear as a solid from a distance. Feel free to make different color choices, however, please recognize that every color will be used in two different positions: the tree and background. Also, *If you are using directional fabric and particular about it's placement, you will need to purchase extra yardage. The amount will depend on the size of the print.

	2 yards flannel for design wall

	3/8 yard of 4 different small-scale white and black prints
	3/8 yard of 4 different small-scale gray prints

3/8 yard of 4 different small-scale blue prints
3/8 yard of 4 different small-scale black prints
5/8 yard fabric for the binding
3 3/4 yards fabric for the backing

Class Prep

PLEASE PRE-CUT FABRIC FOR BLOCKS PRIOR TO CLASS

To save time in class, you are welcome to precut the fabric for your blocks as follows:

From each of the 16 prints for the blocks, cut 1 strip 12 1/2" by width of fabric. Crosscut each strip into two rectangles, 11" x 12" 1/2" for a total of 8 per color group, 32 total.

Bring the remaining yardage for each print to class,
(approximately 12 1/2" x 18" each).
