We will cover the following techniques in this class; selecting fabrics and working with colour values, fabric grain, piecing straight lines and curves, and working with acrylic templates that include ¼" seam allowance.

Sewing Machine Required	Select fabrics with a good mix of prints and colour. The amount of fabric you require depends on the size you wish to make your project.
Optional	Required Fabrics and Supplies
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• SHADOW MOON Acrylic template set</li><li>• A large variety of fabric with a good mix of print and colour . You will need some dark or feature prints and some medium value for block background. Small cuts work well (as a guide...from 2 x 10" squares ..one dark, one medium ...you get 2 blocks. Blocks measure 6" finished.)</li><li>• Light value fabric for connecting pieces. 1 yard will make a double/queen size quilt.</li><li>• Neutral cotton thread</li><li>• Size 11 milliners or straw needle for hand piecing</li><li>• ** 0.7mm Mechanical (propelling) pencil with <b>2 or 2B</b> (soft) lead</li><li>• General sewing requirements eg pins</li><li>• Scissors</li><li>• ** Sandpaper board (if hand piecing)</li><li>• If machine piecing bring your sewing machine and rotary cutting equipment. A 28mm rotary cutter and a smaller or rotating mat work best.</li><li>• ** <b>Supplies not carried by The Stitchin' Post</b></li></ul>
