## Course Overview

Welcome to the Penguin Party!  
Thank you for signing up for my Penguin Party workshop at Quilter's Affair 2019! This handout will detail what you should bring to class, as well as some things you can do beforehand to maximize your time in the classroom. Our goal in the class will be to start making blocks for a 50" x 50" Child Quilt with 12 blocks. If you prefer to make a pillow or Lap Quilt, please refer to the patterns for alternate yardages.

## Required Supplies

Sewing Machine and standard sewing kit

Rotary cutter and cutting mat no larger than 18" x 24"

Small rectangular ruler, such as 4" x 14"

Water soluble pen or similar fabric marker of your choice

## Required Pattern

Penguin Party by Elizabeth Hartman

## Required Fabrics

4 print fat quarters (18" x 21") or 12 squares 10" x 10" each for penguin bodies

1/8 yard gold solid fabric such as Kona Grelow or Roasted Pecan for beaks

5/8 yard dark solid fabric such as Kona Black or Pepper for penguins

3/8 yard light solid fabric such as Kona Snow for penguins

1-5/8 yards neutral solid background fabric

The penguin bodies (aka sweaters) can be made from as many

different fabrics as you like, including from a variety of fabric scraps. Flannel may also be used for all or part of this quilt. If you prefer to prewash flannel, please don't hesitate. However, I have found that quilts made with high-quality flannel such as the Robert Kaufman flannels used in my pattern sample, do fine without prewashing as long as the project is finished with an adequate amount of quilting.

#### Class Prep

This class will have a relaxed atmosphere and students are encouraged to experiment with using different fabrics for the penguin bodies/sweaters. I will spend time in class talking about which fabrics I used and why, and will have an assortment of fabric scraps on hand for students to play with. Please come to class having cut all of the dark, light, and gold fabrics for the penguins and the background fabric.

## MATERIALS

	<b>Pillow Cover</b> 20" x 20"	<b>Child Quilt</b> 50" x 50"	<b>Lap Quilt</b> 60" x 66"
<b>Penguin Body Fabrics</b>	1 square, 10" x 10"	4 fat quarters,* or 12 squares, 10" x 10" each	5 fat quarters,* or 20 squares, 10" x 10" each
<b>Gold Solid Fabric for Beaks</b>	1/8 yard	1/8 yard	1/8 yard
<b>Dark Solid Fabric for Penguins</b>	1/8 yard	5/8 yard	1 yard
<b>White Solid Fabric for Penguins</b>	1/8 yard	3/8 yard	1/2 yard
<b>Background Fabric</b>	3/8 yard	1-5/8 yards	3 yards
<b>Backing Fabric</b>	5/8 yard	3-3/8 yards	4 yards
<b>Binding Fabric</b>	1/8 yard	1/2 yard	5/8 yard
<b>Batting</b>	1 piece 22" x 22", and 2 pieces, 16" x 22" each	54" x 54"	64" x 70"
<b>Muslin Lining</b>	1-1/2 yards	N/A	N/A

\*Fat quarters measure 18" x 21" each. Yardages are based on fabric at least 42" wide. You will also need the fabric marking tool of your choice and, for the pillow project, a 20" square pillow form.
