Course Overview

Just for Fun – the best kind for a Friday class! And fabric selection is easy – a jelly roll and one more fabric, maybe should call it a “feature fabric”. It’s not really what I would call a background, it has another role to play. The size of the finished quilt is 56” x 60”. You may want to add a border, so get some more of your “featured” fabric.

Experience Level

Fabric Selection

Pick your jelly roll – be sure it has 40 – 2 ½” x 42” (WOF) strips.

Decide on a fabric you want to go with it. Once this is done, you are ready. There is some pre-class cutting.

Sewing Machine Required

Fabric Amounts

Featured fabric – 1 1/4 yards—if you want to have a bit more for maybe a border – get 1 3/4 yards. If you want to use this for a binding, you will need another ½ yard.

1 – jelly roll, again be sure it has 40 -- 2 ½” strips.

Required Supplies

Basic sewing supplies including rotary cutter, cutting mat, rulers.

Along with your sewing machine, have two or three pre-wound bobbins.

Pre-class Cutting Instructions

1. From your Featured Fabric cut a total of 8 – 4 ½” x 42” (WOF) strips. Then cut these strips into 48 – 4 ½” x 6 ½” strips.

2. Using your jelly roll, pick 16 strips to pre-cut pieces from.

(Set the other 24 aside and bring them to class.)

From each of the 16 jelly roll strips cut 3 – $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles and also cut 3 – $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles from the same strip.

When cutting is complete you will have 48 – $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles and also 48 – $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.

Cutting is complete and you are now ready for class.
