

Class Description:

Hashabout is a fun, Prescriptive Improv quilt project. Typical of Scott's Urban Folk Style, this quilt embodies a clean modern design, that honors the current fascination with Hashtags that control and direct Social Media these days. Colorful and Scrappy this quilt can be worked up in a myriad of color schemes. I will show some tricks to getting your hashtags looking good and a few extra ideas for variations on the theme.

Supply List:

sewing machine with ¼ inch foot or at least your ability to make accurate ¼ inch seams
rotary cutter, cutting mat, and 18" or longer straight ruler.

Pattern (available at Stitchin' Post website)

Thread

Other basic sewing supplies: seam ripper, pins, etc.

Fabric list:

5 yards of assorted bright prints for blocks, sashing squares, border pieces, pieced binding.

2 ½ yards background fabric (white print in photo)

1 yard dark border fabric

Pre-cutting options:

I like to create as we go, so I don't encourage a lot of pre-cutting, but I also know that it helps in getting more done in class.

That being said, if you like you can cut these precuts:

From the assorted bright prints cut:

15 - 10 ½"×12" rectangles

14 - 9" squares

60 - 2 ½" squares

15 matching sets of: 1 - 2 ½" ×12" rectangle and 1 - 1 ½" ×12" rectangle

15 set matching sets of: 2 - 1 ½" ×13 ½" rectangles

14 matching sets of: 2 - 1 ½" ×9" rectangles and 2 - 1 ½"×10" rectangles

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
